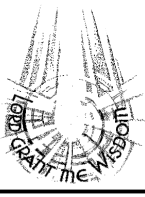

Theme— The Mass

The words of consecration are frequently referred to today as the account of the institution of the Eucharist. There is an intended shift of emphasis here and it has a lot to recommend it. The idea is to move away from an automatic understanding of what happens when the words are said by the priest. The reality which such an automatic understanding could easily obscure is that God is always the master of God's own gift. This truth can help us to avoid taking God's gift for granted.

Prayer of Oscar Romero

It helps now and then, to step back and take the long view.

The kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, It is beyond our vision.

We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work.

Nothing we do is complete,

which is another way of saying that the kingdom always lies beyond us.

No statement says all that could be said.

No prayer fully expresses our faith.

No confession brings perfection.

No pastoral visit brings wholeness.

No programme accomplishes the church's mission.

No set of goals and objectives includes everything.

This is what we are about:

We plant seeds that will one day grow.

We water seeds already planted,

knowing that they hold future promise.

We lay foundations that will need further development.

We provide yeast that produces effects

beyond our capabilities.

We cannot do everything and there is a

sense of liberation in realizing that.

This enables us to do something, and to do it very well.

It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning,

a step along the way, an opportunity for God's grace

to enter and to do the rest.

We may never see the end results,

but that is the difference between the

master builder and the worker.

We are workers, not master builders, ministers not messiahs.

We are prophets for a future not our own.
