Mass Theme - Téama Aitrinn

The question: "Who is Jesus?" is the underlying one behind the stories of the Gospel. Today that question is asked explicitly. The answer to the question is one which only gradually emerged in the earliest Christian communities. What gave impetus to this question was the fact that Jesus died, apparently a failure and abandoned by most of those who were his followers and perhaps also by god. His subsequent presence among the group of disciples is described by a number of terms in the New Testament; resurrection, exaltation, glorification. This was interpreted by the first Christian communities as God's vindication of him.
